If you could take a look inside of my heart an see the breaks and empty spaces you would see that what I've been through has torn me apart than maybe you could understand me better. But fight me till the end if this is what it takes....I only ask that you please never give up on me."

I have reflected on the note often in the past couple of weeks and see the fragility and the strength that becomes the bond between each FRYSC staff member and the students we serve. It is hard for me to pick one program of focus that reflects more importance than another. What I do see that makes the difference is the collaboration, focused leadership, strong moral adhesion to good decision making, compassion, perseverance, trust, and a strong commitment to serving our youth.

This year our FRYSC Coordinators nominated our Superintendent for the Friends of FRYSC Award which was presented to Tim Eaton during our FRYSC Appreciation breakfast. Our Superintendent plans to retire at the end of this fiscal year. His commitment to our students has resulted in:
